ANNUAL REPORT 2022

In 2022, The International Focusing Institute (TIFI) was full of activity, fulfilling our mission to spread Focusing and felt sensing throughout the world. We have a vibrant community of people who do this alongside us. Some love Focusing because it has made their lives richer and helped them to navigate the vicissitudes of life; some are psychotherapists who find Focusing vital to their work; some are philosophers who see the potential of Focusing and felt sensing to understand the world and live in it with greater meaning. Our work at TIFI is to support and encourage all the many ways that felt sensing can bring relevance and clarity to people. This annual report shows the state of the Institute's work, some of the means by which we furthered our mission in 2022, and celebrates the many people who take part through their contributions of time, talent and treasure.

MEMBERSHIP

NUMBERS: As of the writing of this report, we have 2,140 members. Of these, 225 are Coordinators, 60 are Coordinators-in-Training, 990 are Certified Focusing Professionals (Trainers and non-Coordinator FOTs), 423 are Trainees, 425 are affiliate members and 9 honorary members. These are comparable to last year's numbers, with an overall increas of about 3%.

In August 2022, TIFI announced our "Equity in Membership" revision of worldwide membership rates. TOTAL: There are 225 Coordinators, an increase of about 9 from last year. THINKING AT THE EDGE

NEW TAE PROFICIENCY AWARD – An exciting new development is the creation of TIFI's TAE Proficiency Award. This Award indicates a basic competence in Thinking at the Edge, and makes one eligible to find a TAE partner through the TAE Partnership Network. SCHOLARSHIPS: We once again gave more than \$20,000 in scholarships for the Gendlin Symposium, the Advanced and Certification Weeklong and the Felt Sense Conference.

HYBRID WEEKLONG FOR ADVANCED FOCUSERS:

We had our first hybrid Weeklong, with 8 people together in Connecticut, 15 people together in Dublin, plus 38 others who participated online only. Another 7 volunteers helped with translation and Zoom support, bringing total participation to 68. We were delighted that our hybrid format

worked so well and so we're doing the <u>Weeklong for Advanced Focusers</u> in the same way in 2023.

FUNDRAISING – focusing.org/donate



- The Board meets monthly.
- The Board finalized the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion statement, which can now be found at
 focusing.org/board. This important statement of the Board's values was revised alongside minor
 revisions to the Diversity of Approaches statement. Both statements were finalized only after extensive
 consultation with members.
- For the second year, the Board held online meetings for members in the fall.
- The Board sent a letter to Coordinators in late 2022, expressing the intent for TIFI to use the phrase
 "Experiential Focusing" (in lieu of simply Focusing) on focusing.org with the primary purpose of creating a
 phrase that automated translation services would learn to translate properly. There was a strong
 response, which caused the Board to delay any decision. It is going over feedback during 2023.

FINANCES

Income from membership bounced back in 2021 after a drop in 2020. Income from online classes and events, on the other hand, did not remain at the increased level that we saw in the first year of the pandemic.
